PREFACE | FOR THE DEAD The hope of resurrection in Christ


Cardinal:

At the time he was betrayed and entered willingly into his Passion, he took bread and, giving thanks, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying:


Take this, all of you, and eat of it, for this is my Body,


